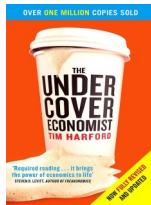
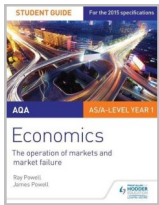
WHERE ARE THE BOOKS?

Economic Development & Growth	338.9

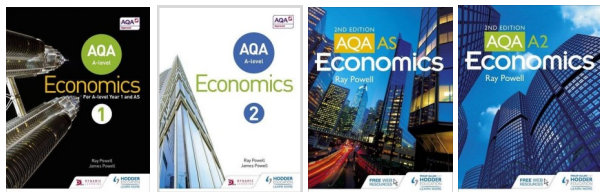
