## IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING YEAR ONE EXAMINATIONS

# Ruok?

Ruok? Is a young people's (10-18) substance misuse service working to offer a young person and family friendly service, reducing harm caused by alcohol and drug use.

Luci Hammond from Ruok? is at YAC on Monday 3 July running a drop in between 1pm and 6pm. This will be happening on the first Monday of every month.

YAC is at 11 St George's Pl, Brighton BN1 4GB, opposite St Peter's Church near the Level.

Any young person under 18 is welcome to access this drop in whether they feel their substance use is problematic or not. This is just as much an opportunity to ask questions and get information and advice as it is to access ongoing support.



We know that young adults who experience unusual distressing experiences (e.g. psychosis) can have difficulties in doing the everyday things that they want to do. Research in this area has identified key things which may be preventing young adults from living a fulfilling life, and the results have been ground-breaking so far, but we want to know more!

We, the UNICORn research team, are researchers based at the University of Sussex and Sussex Partnership NHS Foundation Trust and we are eager to help young adults with our research.

We are currently running a large study within Sussex NHS which focuses on understanding more about what young adults do in their everyday lives and their experience of this. We are interested in comparing young people with and without unusual distressing experiences (e.g. psychosis) to further understand how we can help young adults improve their wellbeing and lead a fulfilling life.

To do this, we are currently looking for individuals to take part in the study as a control group (without an experience of psychosis). We are interested in talking to individuals:

Ø **18-40 years**

Ø **Not currently experiencing mental health difficulties**

Taking part would involve completing some questionnaires, interviews, tasks and computerised tasks. We are able to give participants £20 for their time and people who have taken part so far have found this to be a positive experience.

We would be so very grateful if you were able to advertise this within your college. Do you possibly have an internal webpage for students?






